A Senryū by JaLynn Hope

You don't see color.  
But my color is my cape,  
And I wear my pride.

I wrote this poem after a discussion with my school's student equity group (in which we discuss equity related shortcomings of the school and community) in April 2021, and later revised it to reflect the prompt of the scholarship. My attempt was to express my discontent with using the phrase 'I don't see color' as a way of telling a person of color that they aren't racist. Not only does it incorrectly imply that people should have to vocalize the belief that the speaker isn't racist, it also implies that African Americans don't have a culture worth seeing.
